

## **Sports Premium Funding 2017 – 2018**

### **About the funding**

The government provides additional funding for the provision of PE (physical education) and sport in Primary schools. £150 million per annum was provided between 2013-16. The funding - jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport – was extended to 2017-18 and is allocated to primary school head teachers.

The funding is ring fenced and can only be spent on the provision of PE and sport in schools.

Funding for schools has been calculated based on the number of primary-aged pupils as recorded in the annual schools census in January. West Ashted Primary School was awarded £15,123 for 2017-18.
