

West Ashtead PE sports premium 2018-2019

What is the Sports Premium funding?

The government provides additional funding for the provision of PE (physical education) and sport in Primary schools. The funding is jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. The funding is ring fenced and can only be spent on the provision of PE and sport in schools.

Funding for schools has been calculated based on the number of primary-aged pupils as recorded in the annual schools census in January. This year we have been allocated £19,145.

This will include children being able to attend more Inspire and Aspire events.• Employ a sports coach to support the teaching of PE throughout the school and support staff with delivering their PE lessons.• Continue to offer a wide range of extra-curricular clubs, particularly lunchtime clubs to engage the least active.• Developing links we have already have with state and independent schools to help broaden our PE provision.• To identify the children who don't meet national curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety and offer support to those children to raise attainment.
